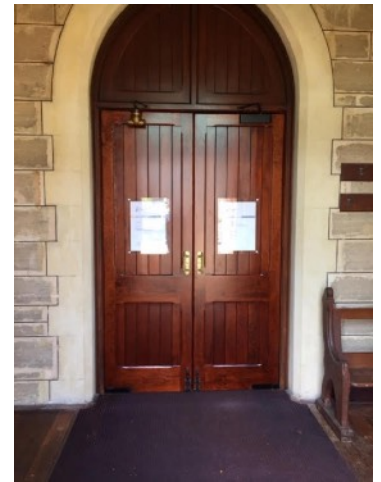


Noises from:

The doors came to us in a poor condition scratched and dented and hundreds of drawing pin holes over who knows how many years of Church notices.

Our first job was to remove all the door furniture which was cleaned repaired and painted. Then a team of members scraped off all the old varnish, then we sanded the old stain off to get the doors back to bare timber. When all the dents and scratches were sanded out we re-stained the doors to match existing woodwork then applied several coats of varnish. Then we refitted all the renovated door furniture and fitted the doors back in the Church.

Chairman's Report: KEY THRUSTS FOR THE NEXT YEAR

Overall, I aim to make the Shed become a more member-based organisation than a structural or financial one. Structure, operations and money are important, but these must be driven by the human factor.

The strategies to achieve this goal are as follows:

- That all members of this Shed are treated equally, no matter what their skills, abilities, attitudes and personality are.
- All members have equal access to the facilities
- All members (particularly Management and Overseers) are expected to treat all others in the Shed and the equipment in the Shed with respect and positivity
- Any member who does not behave in the above manner needs to be taken aside and rationally and calmly reprimanded- no bullying or public condemnation.
- If serious, the above needs to be done by the Chairman and if serious enough to be done in writing as well.
- All but minor decisions need to be made with careful consideration. The considerations need to be communicated clearly, major ones in writing, so as to give all relevant members time and say in the decisions.

To this end: Awareness of what is going on in our Shed; Report from the zone meeting; Appeal to members to get photos and articles into Jamie for publication; ways of getting more members involved in Our Shed' operations.
