#### **President's Report 2025**

## **Nutrition and Dietetics Students' Association (NADSA)**

#### Overview

2025 has been a productive and rewarding year for NADSA, marked by strengthened partnerships, engaging events, and improved operational continuity.

- Collaboration and Engagement: Our relationship with the Nutrition Society of Australia (NSA) continues to grow stronger. Key highlights include the Dr Emma Beckett Workshop which provided valuable professional and community engagement opportunities for students.
- Improved Handover: This year's committee transition was significantly smoother than in 2024, eliminating the need for a NADSA-specific handover. The Guild's handover process proved sufficient and effective.
- Event Success: NADSA's involvement in Curtin Health Fest was highly successful, drawing strong student participation. The event demonstrated the benefit of interactive activities such as the use of Curtin's blender bike which should be considered for future events, including O-Day.
- Organisational Development: The 2026 committee will be the first to implement NADSA's new social media guidelines and club banner, pending their completion, setting a consistent standard for future communication and branding.

### Challenges

While 2025 brought many successes, several challenges provided learning opportunities for future committees:

- Event Attendance: Providing free tickets to the Dr Emma Beckett Workshop unfortunately resulted in a lower turnout than expected, suggesting that a ticket fee may enhance engagement and perceived value.
- Marketing Consistency: Event promotion continues to require earlier, stronger, and more consistent marketing efforts to maximise attendance and engagement.
- Member Engagement: There was limited involvement from first-year nutrition and postgraduate dietetics students, indicating a need for more targeted outreach to these cohorts.

• Committee Size and Commitment: A larger committee did not necessarily improve functionality. Future committees should aim for 8–10 highly committed members for optimal performance.

#### **Future Directions**

Looking ahead, NADSA has several exciting opportunities to further its objectives and enhance member value:

- Rural Placement Grants: In line with NADSA's founding objectives, the committee should establish a grant program supporting dietetics students undertaking rural placements, who often incur out-of-pocket expenses exceeding \$1000 for a two-week placement.
- Allied Health Collaboration: Strengthen inter-club collaboration within the health faculty. A joint group chat has been established on NADSA's Instagram to facilitate communication with other allied health clubs.
- Charity Events: Plan a Charity Colour Run in collaboration with the Curtin Association of Medical Students (CAMS) to promote community health and raise funds for a good cause.
- Venue Utilisation: Make greater use of Curtin Stadium facilities for NADSA events — such as free group fitness classes and court bookings — to increase visibility and engagement.

## **Advice for the Incoming Committee**

To continue NADSA's momentum, the following strategies are recommended:

## Event Strategy:

- Increase the number of paid ticketed or fundraising events, beginning with the 2026 Careers Night, while keeping the Sundowner free for accessibility and inclusivity.
- Consider allocating a minimum of \$200 per student for rural placement grants.

### Social Media and Branding:

 Prioritise early and consistent social media engagement, including prompt committee introductions at the start of the year.

- Appoint a dedicated Social Media Manager to maintain activity and brand consistency.
- Take plenty of photos at all NADSA events to build a strong visual presence.

# • Training and Preparation:

 Ensure the new committee attends the Guild-run workshops before O-Week to strengthen governance, planning, and event delivery capabilities.

#### Conclusion

2025 has been a year of growth and consolidation for NADSA, setting a strong foundation for the years ahead. With continued collaboration, strategic event planning, and a focus on communication and engagement, the incoming 2026 committee is well-positioned to expand NADSA's impact and strengthen its presence within the Curtin community.
