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# WELCOME

Welcome to Fassifern Junior Rugby League Club Inc “The Bombers”.

We hope your season with us is enjoyable and that your children grow and learn the great game of Rugby League within our Club.

First and foremost, we are here for the kids. From watching the players form friendships in U6's and try to find their feet to seeing them grow in confidence over the years and then saying farewell to them in their final season in U18's, it is an enjoyable experience and one of our aims is to have a Club where children can feel comfortable to improve their skills at their own rate.

We have collated this booklet for a few reasons:-

To ensure that all players/parents/volunteers are aware of some general information that will assist you during the season;

- To give players/parents/volunteers an insight into our Club.
- To let you know all the contact details for Committee Members.
- To advise you what the Club expects from players/parents/volunteers when you become a member of our Club.

We have listed an insert of the Code of Conduct for Rugby League at the end of the brochure and shall provide you with the full website details and recommend you take the time to read through.

## General Information

**Blue Cards**\_- Each member of the club who does volunteer work (ie ALL parents and carers of players), needs to have a current Blue Card, issued by the Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian, QLD. If you do not currently have a Blue Card, please see one of the Committee Members. There is no cost for the Blue Card for Volunteers. It is a QRL requirement for our club to host home games.

**Committee Meetings**\_- Meetings are held each month and all Committee Members are encouraged to attend. Meeting dates, times and location will be advertised in the newsletter, Facebook and our website page. It would

be great if at least one parent from each team could attend the monthly meetings. This could be done on a rotation basis. Decisions affecting the whole club are made at these meetings, so it is important if you want input into how the club works, or if you have any suggestions or feedback about the club please come along.

**Complaints**\_- Should you have any issues or concerns please email the details to our Club Secretary. Your issue/concern will be discussed at the next Committee Meeting, and a response will be given to you by return email. Alternatively, you can attend the Committee Meeting to discuss your issues/concerns.

**Training Days / Times**\_ - Generally, U6 – U12 train on a Wednesday from 5:30- 6:30pm and U13 – 18 is at the discretion of the coach, please see your team manager or our Facebook page. The Coach / Manager of your child’s team will notify you of the training day/time. As our Coaches are volunteers, they often have to work out training around work commitments, so dates and times may vary. ***If your child/children cannot attend a training session, please ensure you notify the Coach/Manager as soon as possible.***

**Game Day**\_- Game times / venues will be listed on our Facebook page and via your team chat. If you are unsure of the field locations all Club locations are listed on the RLI website ([Field Locations | Rugby League Ipswich](#)) We have listed the addresses at the end of this booklet. ***Should your child/children not be able to attend the game please notify the Coach/Manager as soon as possible.***

**Gear**\_- Game Day socks and shorts are only available through the club. Prices are listed below under the heading “Merchandise”.

Mouthguards are strongly encouraged to be worn at games and training by all players. It is recommended you go to a chemist or see your family dentist to have a mouthguard made/fitted prior to each season. We have a basic range available for purchase at the canteen if you don’t have one on the day.

Headgear is also a strongly encouraged item to be worn whilst playing every game

Jerseys are supplied by the Club, and most teams have a roster for the washing of these. Please see your child's Team Manager for details.

Training shirts are supplied by the club every 2 years, this is included in your registration fees. If your child/children requires another training shirt they can be purchased from the Club within the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the training shirt. Prices are listed below under the heading "Merchandise".

**Injuries**- Should a player receive an injury whilst playing, a qualified First Aid Officer will attend to them and devise the best course of action. Parents and Spectators **ARE NOT PERMITTED to enter onto the field** whilst their child is injured. Should the parent be required on the field, a Duty Official will advise the parent accordingly. Should any of your child's medical or personal details change throughout the season, please inform the Coach/Manager.

Should you, your child or a patron sustain an injury whilst at the field, a committee member needs to be informed as soon as possible, and an incident report must be completed.

**VOLUNTEER POSITIONS**

Other than being a Committee Member with the Bombers there are many other ways you can volunteer within the Club. Outside of the Coach and Manager, most of the Volunteer positions listed below will only take up one hour of your time at home games only. If you are interested in League Safe, First Aid Officer or Ground Manager, the Club will reimburse the cost to complete the course. Please email the Club Secretary for details.

**Club Referee's** – A great way to earn a little extra cash. Club Referee's are paid per game. You have the opportunity to not only referee at our home games but can assist other Clubs when they are hosting home games. If you are interested in becoming a Club Referee please email our Club

Secretary for details on courses held.

**Canteen Assistant** – This Volunteer position is for one hour prior to your child’s game. There are a number of duties in the canteen from set up, making burgers, cooking chips, serving at front counter, bbq, clean up. We welcome and appreciate the assistance of players siblings. Please note, age restrictions may apply to volunteers with the handling food etc.

**Coach / Manager Position** – The Coach / Manager is a pivotal role within the Bombers. If you have any queries or concerns during the Season please contact a Committee Member.

**Communication** - As Managers and Coaches you will be the main conduit of communication between the committee and the parents and players. Messages will be sent to you by email, group chat or text and we would like you to distribute these to your teams. Please ensure you have the correct contact details for your team and if you find a mistake on our list make sure it is communicated to us so the database can be kept as accurate as possible. You may be asked to chase up particular players if they have outstanding registration fees. Please remember players cannot take the field unless their registration is current for the 2026 Season. In this regard, the Registrar will provide you with an updated weekly team list for the first few months so you can ensure only “registered” players take the field.

You should also encourage parents to use our website, team group chats (eg Messenger) and Facebook as much as possible so that information can be accessed easily.

**Coordination** - A lot of the role of manager is to help coordinate things for your team. An example of this is to help collect information for sizes of training shirts, organise volunteers from your team to help with canteen, coordinate kids for photos etc.

All managers in the U6s – U12s will be under the mentoring of our Junior Club Co-Ordinator, Melanie Rowe. Guidance and advice are given on how to successfully run your team. Manager meetings are held regularly on training nights to ensure your feeling equipped and supported in this important role.

Along with the Coach you may be asked to assist to either get players from

another team to play with your team or supply players to another team. The Registrar will work with you to make sure these players are available for selection.

**Game days** - Managers need to ensure that team lists are submitted for their players by Thursday night each week – with Jersey Numbers so you will need to liaise with the coach. The registrar will assist in adding players to the squad which can then be picked to complete the team sheet digitally in the MySideline App that managers have access to.

Prior to the game (15 mins before kick off), the selected team needs to be checked by the manager– any late changes need to be corrected on the manager app (MySideline).

Managers of all teams will need to arrange to have one of the team parents to wash the jerseys each week and ensure that they are returned prior or brought to the next training night.

Managers, need to assist in encouraging parents to help out and volunteer in club activities. At home games organise parents to be duty officials, gate keeper, time keeper, canteen assistant, identify a touch judge for games (needs to be someone over 14 yrs and wearing closed in shoes). It is expected you do a roster system to share the volunteer positions within your team. You will be given printouts and shown how to do this by the Junior Club Manager.

For all international teams it is the manager's responsibility to ensure that ID checks are completed prior to all games with the opposing team and ground manager of the facility. When you arrive at a field find the Ground Manager and ask them when and how they would like this completed. Ensure all players and team officials photos are clear and up to date prior to ID checks.

Additionally, managers need to score live for their own team for all international games via the Mysideline app. When the game has finished the manager and opposing manager are to check the scores together and only the home team submits the final score.

***A teams failure to provide the level of assistance required may result in the teams game being forfeited or withdrawn from the competition.***

**League Safe**– This Volunteer position is conducted during your child's game. Within the clubs, the league safe member will have the final decision in player welfare as well as observing and monitoring players who have been removed from the field of play through injury/illness.

**Responsibilities and Duties** - The League safe member must have minimum qualification to enter the field of play. Note: the word ARL League Safe must be printed on the back of the shirt/vest.

- Access to the field of play (unlimited access as per the following conditions:-
- When his/her team is in possession to conduct interchange and to administer water only when a try has been scored;
- During a time out called by the referee for an injury during technical stoppages in play (except scrums);
- On-field personnel are not allowed on the field of play after the referee has ordered a scrum until the ball has emerged and a team is in possession must enter and leave the field of play from an on-side position.

**Duties: -**

- To administer water.
- To assist in the interchange process.
- To convey messages. NOTE: Messages ***MUST NOT*** be given to the team whilst play is in progress.

Knowledge and Skills Required:

Ideally a League safe member is someone who:

Holds appropriate qualifications as required by the league/region/state (League safe Certificate of Attendance or an accredited NRL First Aid Officers Certificate)

The Club will reimburse the cost of the League Safe course to the Volunteer. Once you have paid for the course, completed and received your Certificate please provide proof of payment to the Treasurer who will reimburse you. Please note League Safe shirts must be worn at all games. One League Safe shirt has been provided to all teams. Should you wish to purchase your own League Safe shirt, please contact the club secretary.

**Duty Official** – All teams need to have one duty official at all games whether they are at home or away.

**Responsibilities and Duties** – The Duty Official should:

Whilst the game is in progress, you must be actively engaged in controlling the field and surrounds. (no spectators or children or photographers are allowed inside the fenced or roped areas);

Ensure the crowd are following the code of conduct and behaving in the correct manner;

If there are any issues report to the Ground Manager

**Time Keeping & Scoring (Internationals)** – The time keeping and scoring person is responsible for keeping the scoring and timing of a game.

**Responsibilities and Duties**

- Keep and record time;
- Keep and record score;
- Sound the siren;

We do not keep score for U6-U11

**Timekeeping**

**Mini**

U6 – U9      4 x 8 minute periods      2 minutes between periods.

**Mod**

U10 – U12    2 x 20 minute halves      5 minutes half time.

**International**

U13 – U17    2 x 30 minute halves      5 minutes half time.

## **Time Out**

No time out for injuries except in Final Series.

Sin Bin 10 min all International games

Sin Bin time is for playing time only and is calculated after the Referee signals time – on or when the play re-commences, either of which should occur after the dismissed player crosses the touch line. Time in the Sin Bin is suspended if further time is called off during the 10 minute period. Suspended time re-commences when time is signalled “on” by the Referee. Suspended time is not included in halftime. A player can be with his team during the half time break.

Blood bin - A reserve player may temporarily replace a player receiving treatment for bleeding. The player must return to the field within 10 mins or take no further part in the match.

**First Aid Officer (FAO/Blue Shirt)**- Sports Trainers &/or FAO’s work in conjunction with the Coach to ensure all players reach and maintain required fitness levels and ensure they have a safe, healthy and enjoyable training and playing environment. There are two levels:

### **1. Accredited Level 1 NRL Sports Trainer (Blue Shirt)**

**Responsibilities and Duties** - The NRL Sports Trainer has unlimited access to attend to an injured / ill player and to administer water, but is not allowed or permitted to carry, convey or deliver messages.

- To assist by observing and monitoring players during play as well as those who have been removed from the field of play through injury / illness.
- To assist an injured / ill player on and off the field of play at training and / or a game.
- To assist an injured / ill player on the field in the absence of a Head Trainer or when more than one Accredited ARL Sports Trainer is needed.

## **Knowledge and Skills Required**

Ideally a Sports Trainers &/or FAO member is someone who:

Holds a minimum qualification of ARL Sports Trainer.

## **2. Accredited Level 2 Sports Trainer/Head Trainer (Orange Shirt)**

**Responsibilities and Duties** - The NRL Head Trainer has unlimited access to monitor players and administer water during play and to attend to an injured/ill player.

- The Head Trainer will be the most senior person within the NRL Sports Trainers
- The Accredited NRL Head Trainer will make the final decision on a player's welfare in the absence of a medical professional
- Coaches / administrators / players must always comply with the decision of the ARL Head Trainer.
- All directions given to on field personnel by the Level 2 Sports Trainer / Head Trainer must be adhered to at all times.

### **Knowledge and Skills Required**

Ideally an NRL Head Trainer is someone who:

Holds a minimum qualification NRL Sports Trainer – Level 2

### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

Every international team (U13-Opens) must have a qualified First Aid Officer at each game (home and away games).

The aim at the Bombers is to have a FAO for every team. If you are interested, please email your details to our Club Secretary.

### **THANK YOU TO ALL OUR WONDERFUL VOLUNTEERS**

Our club is run entirely by volunteers. Quality volunteers are critical to the conduct and growth of the game because they determine the quality of the club environment and, hence the experience for players and their families.

Volunteers are the glue that holds together every Rugby League Club in Australia. They dedicate hours of time and energy every year, working in a variety of ways and completing many necessary tasks. Without the

dedication of these volunteers, Clubs, as we know them, would not exist. Community Rugby League continues to thrive through the efforts of volunteers and for this reason the players thank you.

### **Rights & Responsibilities of Volunteers**

Volunteers have the right to:

- An orientation to the Club;
- A clear job description
- Job Satisfaction
- Support & respect from the club & Co-workers
- Guidance from someone who is experienced & well informed.
- Have access to training if needed;
- Be involved in decision making (*where appropriate*);
- Know who they are accountable to & have clearly defined channels of communication open to them;
- Know what tasks they will be expected to perform and say “no” to tasks they are unable to do or do not want to do.

Volunteers have the responsibility to:

- Be sure they have the time to devote to the position/task;
- Be committed for the entirety of the season AND in the off season until you are either reappointed or are relieved from your position.
- Be loyal – offer suggestions, but don’t “knock” other people’s ideas;
- Be willing to learn – training is essential to any job well done;
- Keep on learning – know all you can about the club and your job;
- Welcome supervision – you will do a better job and enjoy it more;
- Speak Up – ask about things you don’t understand;
- Be dependable – do what you agree to do;
- Be a team player – respect the function of other volunteers and treat them fairly;
- Provide feedback on the work being done

### **CODE OF CONDUCT – PLAYER**

- Be a good sport. Respect all good play whether from your team or the opposition and shake hands with and thank the opposition players and officials after the game – win, lose or draw.

- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- Always respect the referee's decision.
- Never become involved in acts of foul play.
- Honour both the spirit and letter of the competition rules and live up to the highest ideals of ethics and sportsmanship; avoid gamesmanship and respect the traditions of the game.
- Never engage in disrespectful conduct of any sort including profanity, sledging, obscene gestures, offensive remarks, trash-talking, taunting or other actions that are demeaning to other players, officials or supporters.
- Care for and respect the facilities and equipment made available to you during training and competition.
- Safeguard your health; don't use any illegal or unhealthy substances.
- Recognize that many officials, coaches and referees are volunteers who give up their time to provide their services. Treat them with the utmost respect.
- Be a beacon of good behaviour; that serves as a shining example of positive conduct to your fellow club-mates. You are a role model to these younger players and a representative of the Fassifern Bombers, so wear your club colours with pride to show our high standard of proper behaviour within the community.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT PARENT / SPECTATOR VOLUNTEER**

- Condemn all violent or illegal acts, whether they are by players, coaches, officials, parents or spectators.
- Respect the referee's decisions – don't complain or argue about calls or decisions during or after a game.
- Behave! Unsportsmanlike language, harassment or aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Encourage players to play by the rules and to respect opposition players and officials.
- Never ridicule or scorn a player for making a mistake – respect their efforts.
- Understand that sport is part of a total life experience, and the benefits of involvement go far beyond the final score of a game.
- Participate in positive cheering that encourages the players in the team you are supporting; do not engage in any cheering that taunts or

intimidates opponents, their fans or officials.

- Remember that children participate in Rugby League for their own enjoyment, not yours!
- At all times, follow the directions of the Ground Manager and/or other match day staff.
- Never arrive at a Junior League game under the influence of alcohol, never bring alcohol to a Junior League game.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT – COACH**

- Actively discourage foul play and/or unsportsmanlike behaviour by players.
- Seek to maximise the participation and enjoyment for all players regardless of ability.
- Avoid the tendency to over-use a talented player.
- Treat all players as equals, regardless of their talent.
- Show concern and caution towards all sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a physician and/or sports trainer to the letter when determining when an injured player is ready to recommence training or playing.
- Teach players that an honest effort and competing to the best of their ability is as important as victory.
- Maintain appropriate, professional relationships with players at all times.
- Maintain a thorough knowledge of the rules of the game and keep abreast of current coaching methods; maintain or improve your current accreditation level.
- Always consider the health, safety and welfare of the players.
- Teach young players to realise that there is a big gap between their play and the professional game; do not coach them as if they are professionals.
- Ensure that your coaching reflects the level of the competition being played.
- Do not be a “winner-at-all-costs” coach.
- As coach, conduct yourself at all times in a manner, and in all situations, that shows leadership, respect for the game of Rugby League and respect for all those that are involved in the game – the players, officials, the fans, the parents, the referees and the media.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

All players, parents, spectators, coaches, referees and officials are covered by the NRL National Code of Conduct.

- No person(s) attending a match, function or event shall:
- Use offensive or obscene language to any participant;
- Enter the Field of Play during the course of a match without the prior approval of the Ground Manager appointed by the home club and/or League;
- Excessively dispute the decision of a referee or touch judge either during or after a match;
- Assault or act with aggression to any person/s;
- Behave in a way contrary to the Code of Conduct and/or the spirit of the game;
- Behave in a way which disturbs the enjoyment of a match, function or event by any other person/s, or brings discredit to the home club and/or League;
- Act in such a way as to exhibit racial intolerance, by language or other conduct, to any person/s;
- Refuse to accept the reasonable direction of the Ground Manager, official of the team/club which that person is supporting, or official of the home club and/or League.
- Clubs are responsible for the conduct of their players, parents/carers of players, coaches, officials and club supporters. Breaches of the Rugby League Code of Conduct may result in penalties, including but not limited to:
  - Suspension of a match and/or
  - Termination of a match (including potential forfeiture of competition points) and/or
  - Monetary fines and/or
  - Suspension of a participant on a temporary or permanent basis and/or
  - Suspension of a club, League or Association on a temporary or permanent basis.

- These penalties are in addition to any penalty which may be imposed by the home League's judiciary. The Bombers also endorses and abides by the Rugby League Ipswich Zero Tolerance Policy.
- Should you have any issues at our own home games please see one of the Committee Members or if you have an issue at an away game please speak to your Coach/Manager and they will pass on the information to the Committee. No Player/Parent/Spectator is to contact the RLI directly.

## **ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – RLI BY LAWS**

- The Bombers support the RLI in their stance against any anti-social behaviour. With this in mind the Club has adopted a three strike policy for poor sportsmanship and misbehaviour at the Club.
- The below is an extract from the RLI By-Laws. You can read the RLI By Laws in their entirety on the RLI web site.
- Any person reported to the Rugby League Ipswich (the "League") and found Guilty by the League of breaching the Code of Conduct will face severe penalties.
- Ground Managers, Club Officials and Referees are instructed to immediately STOP a game of rugby league if a person/s are seen or heard breaching the code. That person/s will be asked to leave the ground before the game resumes. If this instruction is not adhered to the game is to be terminated.
- The Officers of the Executive of the RLI will determine which side (if any) will be awarded the competition points after the RLI Judiciary Panel has heard all evidence.
- Abuse or offensive language to any Player, Referee, Touch Judge, Official or other Spectator will not be tolerated
- Disputing the decision of the Referee or Touch Judge will not be tolerated
- Assault or acting in an aggressive manner to any other person will not be tolerated
- Exhibiting racism either by language or conduct will not be tolerated
- Any other breaches of the Code of Conduct will not be tolerated
- Ground Managers and Club Officials are instructed to report in writing to the League with details of any person breaching the Code. If found guilty of breaching the code, the registration of the player that may be related to that person or attending a match or other RLI event or

function in support of a player may be terminated.

- The onus will be on the player to provide suitable evidence to the RLI Disciplinary Tribunal to show sufficient cause as to why their registration should not be terminated. If a person related to a player has been found guilty under the Code of Conduct or Anti-Social Behaviour Policy the said player must attend a hearing of the RLI Disciplinary Tribunal and offer evidence for consideration as to why their registration should not be terminated.
- If the RLI Disciplinary Tribunal after hearing evidence in relation to this matter believe that it is in the best interest of junior rugby league the Tribunal MAY terminate the registration of the said player for the remainder of the current season.
