To our Youth and Senior teams, I wish you all the very best as you head into the business end of the season. Finals are never given, they're earned, and I know the commitment and hard work will continue across the weeks ahead.

Thank you, as always, to every player, parent, volunteer, coach, sponsor and supporter who continues to make the Vikings such a special place.

Together, we're not only celebrating 60 years of history—we're building an even stronger future for the generations of Vikings still to come.

BRENDEN HODGKINS - HONoured WITH WYNNUM VIKINGS LIFE MEMBERSHIP

One of the most memorable moments from our 60th Anniversary celebrations on Saturday 27 June was the induction of Brenden "Hodgo" Hodgkins as the newest Life Member of the Wynnum Vikings Australian Football Club.

While the day celebrated six decades of our club's history, it was only fitting that we also recognised someone who has dedicated a significant part of his own life to helping shape that history.

Life Membership is the highest honour our football club can bestow. It is reserved for those whose service, leadership and contribution have made a lasting and significant impact on our club and its people.

Brenden's contribution over the past 17 years is exactly that. If you've spent any time around the Vikings during that period, chances are you've crossed paths with Brenden in one role or another. Player. Coach. Supporting parent. Team Manager. Runner. Water Carrier. Volunteer. Committee member. Junior Coordinator. Youth Coordinator. Umpire. President.

Sometimes several of those roles all at once.

But those titles only tell part of the story.

The real measure of Brenden's contribution isn't found in the positions he has held. It's found in the people he has influenced along the way.

Families who arrived at the Vikings and were immediately made to feel welcome.
Young players who simply wanted the opportunity to pull on a Vikings jumper.
Volunteers who found themselves putting their hand up because Brenden asked them to help.
Committee members who worked alongside someone who always put the best interests of the club first.

Throughout his time at the Vikings, Brenden built a reputation as someone who simply got on with the job. Whether it was coaching a team, helping in the canteen, carrying water, running the boundary, attending committee meetings, stepping into Team Manager duties or leading the club as President, his approach never changed.

Whatever the club needed... he did it.

As President for nine years, Brenden helped guide the club through an important period of growth. He was a passionate advocate for junior football, played a significant role in strengthening the pathway into senior football and helped oversee major facility improvements, including our away changerooms and the clubhouse our members enjoy today.

His commitment also earned him enormous respect well beyond the Vikings. Across Division 2 and throughout AFL Queensland, Brenden became recognised as the face of the Wynnum Vikings, representing our club and community football with pride, integrity and professionalism.



Of course, contributions like this are never made by one person alone. We also acknowledge the incredible support of Brenden's wife, Faith, and their children Harry, Brianna and Gordon, who have all played their own part in the Vikings story as players, volunteers and supporters. Their encouragement, patience and understanding over many years made it possible for Brenden to give so much of himself to our football club.

While Life Membership recognises everything Brenden has already given to the Wynnum Vikings, it certainly doesn't mark the end of his journey. He continues to volunteer as an umpire, committee member, supporter and proud Vikings dad, still giving back to the club he has helped shape.

Brenden's legacy won't simply be measured by the number of roles he has held or the years he has served. It will be measured by the people he has encouraged, the families he has welcomed, the volunteers he has inspired and the football club he has helped leave stronger than he found it.

Congratulations, Hodgo, on your richly deserved induction as a Life Member of the Wynnum Vikings Australian Football Club.

Thank you for everything you have given to our club, our people and our community.

CONCUSSION EDUCATION SESSION FOR PARENTS, COACHES AND TEAM OFFICIALS

Player safety is everyone's responsibility, and understanding concussion is a vital part of creating a safe sporting environment for our young athletes.

We are pleased to welcome Alex from Evoxia Physio to the club for a Concussion Education Session for all parents, coaches and team officials.

This informative session will cover:

- How to recognise the signs and symptoms of concussion
- What actions to take if a concussion is suspected on game day
- The importance of proper assessment and management
- Understanding the return-to-play process and recovery guidelines

Early recognition and appropriate management of concussion can make a significant difference to a player's health and wellbeing. This session is designed to provide practical knowledge and confidence so that everyone involved in our club can respond quickly and appropriately when needed.

We strongly encourage all families, coaches and team officials to attend if possible. Working together, we can help ensure the safety and wellbeing of every player on and off the field.

FEMALE FOOTBALL UPDATE

A huge thank you to Lucy, one of our amazing junior coaches, for leading the charge with our recent All Ages Female Football Training Session. It was fantastic to see players of all ages and experience levels coming together to enjoy the game, build confidence, and connect with other women and girls in our football community.

This session was about so much more than football. It was to provide an opportunity for our junior players to see what their future in the game can look like, helping them recognise the pathway from junior football through to youth. Having female role models on the field inspires our young players and shows them that there are exciting opportunities ahead.

It was also wonderful to see mums getting involved. Too often parents spend the season cheering from the sidelines, but these sessions offer a chance to pull on the boots, have some fun, and experience the game alongside their daughters. Football is a sport for everyone, and it's never too late to get involved.

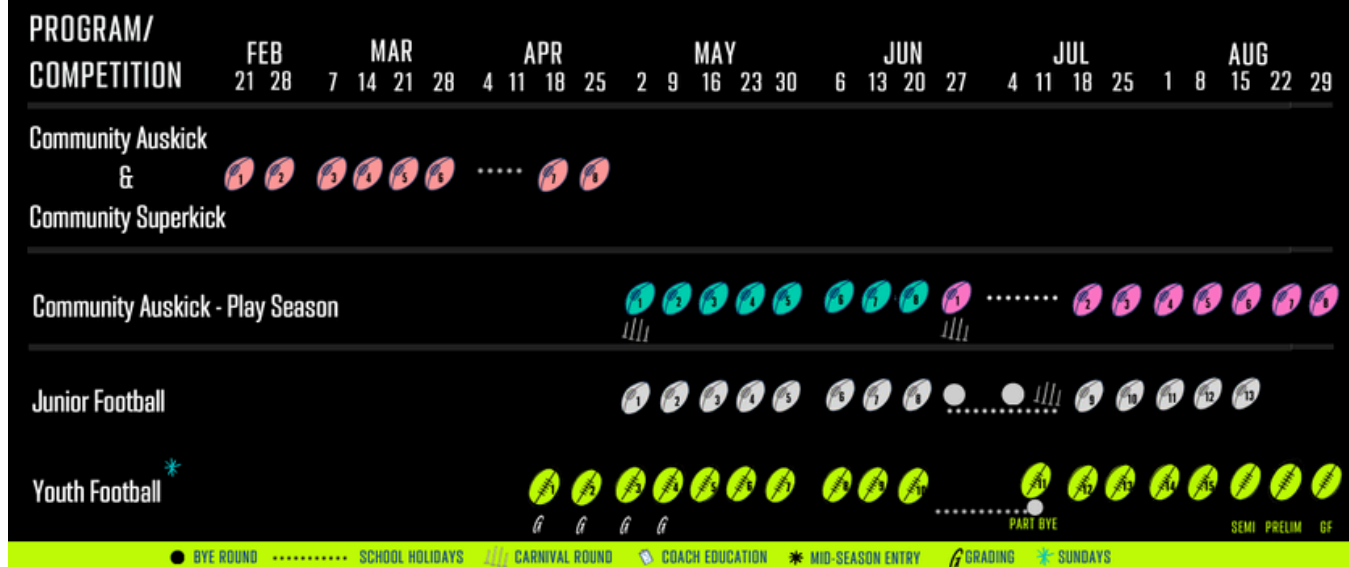
